Since the OGGF was founded in 1994, girls high school teams in Northern Ohio have grown to two divisions with more than 250 teams.

2007 — Katie Rogner of JFK H.S. will graduate from Youngstown State University in 2011 with a degree in Industrial/Systems Engineering after playing golf for four years. She was named YSU Woman athlete of the Year 2010.

2008 — Ariel Witmer of South Range H.S. was also the 2008 Ohio High School Girls Champion and is playing



golf at Longwood University in Virginia, majoring in Biology.

2009 — Taylor Lanning of Perry H.S. is playing golf at Methodist University while studying in the golf management program.

2010 — Caitlin Kempton of Shaker Heights H.S. is playing golf at Mercyhurst College. She is majoring in Education.

Apply now for 2011 scholarships, financial aid to attend tournaments

The pursuit of higher education and a higher level of competition have always been hallmarks of the OGGF.

Each year we provide thousands of dollars in college scholarships and financial assistance for girls to attend tournaments locally, regionally and nationally.

All Ohio high school senior girls are eligible for the scholarships. OGGF reviews every application and rates each candidate based on financial need, academic/extracurricular achievements, golf participation, community service and a written essay.

"Over the past 14 years, \$88,000 has been awarded to more than 85 girls," says Scholarship Committee Chairperson Margaret Swope.

And over the past four years, girls have received an additional \$500 OGGF/Medicus Scholarship. Thank you to Medicus RMG for their loyal and ongoing partnership.

OGGF Open crowns victors

Girls from across the state rose to the top of a full field of players at the 2010 OGGF Open at Avon Oaks Country Club. In a hard-fought competition, only one stroke determined both the individual and team champion.

Individual player Caitlin Kempton from Shaker Heights won by shooting a 79. Coming in one stroke behind was Allison Mitzel, who played for Poland Seminary, and third place was Lia Labate from Magnificat. Six golfers tied with a score of 83 to round out the top golfers.

The team competition was closely contested too coming down to a stroke difference, as Canfield (355) won top honors, followed by Magnificat (356) and Avon (365). Other schools participating

included Bay Village, Perry, Avon Lake, Brecksville-Broadview Heights, Cuyahoga Falls, Laurel, Nardonina and Warren JFK.

Headlined for the past decade by LPGA Tour Professional and Cleveland native Barb Mucha, this year the Open also featured LPGA Hall of Famer Amy Alcott — a friend of our sponsors Jack & Sherry Kahl. The LPGA pros flew in from Florida and California to share their golf wisdom with the younger generation here in Ohio to motivate and inspire them to improve their game.

“Tournaments are really won or lost by the short game,” said Mucha. “No matter how far you drive the ball, if you can’t get up and down without problems, you won’t

win the event.”

They both noted the changes and successes in the game for women.

“When we both played golf in high school, we had to golf on the boys’ team because there were no girls’ teams,” Mucha said. “It is great to be at an event like this and see how much the opportunities in girls golf have really grown over the years.”

Spring Clinics geared to every skill level

Girls ages 8-18 can get a great start on their golf game at the OGGF Spring Clinics on Saturdays in April. Clinics will be held on April 9, 16, 23, 30, from 10-11 a.m. at all locations, except 2CLUB Golf & Learning Center where they are from noon-1 p.m.

These instructional clinics conducted by PGA and LPGA instructors are geared to inform, educate and expand girls' knowledge in all aspects of golf. The format includes instruction for every skill level from beginner to advanced and examines all of the game from full swing to short game to putting.

Girls can participate in one clinic (\$15) or the entire series (for a special package deal of \$50). The deadline to sign up is April 1.
